NLTRW MINI-GRANTS

The National Latin Teacher Recruitment Week committee is making available to all Latin teachers (K-college) in the United States and Canada mini-grants of up to \$200.00 each to support efforts at the local level designed to encourage students to consider a career as a Latin teacher. These efforts are



part of a movement that is National Latin Teacher Recruitment Week but may be held at any time during the school year. Examples of fundable ideas would include postage for a mailing, refreshments for a reception, travel funds for a speaker, promotional materials, etc.

In fact, these funds can be used to purchase sharp looking NLTRW t-shirts which are available with 5 different Latin phrases on the front and

“National Latin Teacher Recruitment Week/First Week in March/Your Future is Our Future” on the back. Choose from *Carpe Diem*, *Cogito Ergo Sum*, *Veni Vidi Vici*, *Facta Non Verba* and *Doce Ut Discas* on a short sleeve t-shirt, a long sleeve t-shirt, or even a sweatshirt. Moreover, you can request personalization with additional school information or a change to school colors. There’s also a flying disk (*carpe discum*) with NLTRW information around the border. Use such items for giveaways and drawings.

The only requirement for accessing NLTRW Mini-Grants is that the funds be used in some significant and visible way to promote the recruitment of Latin teachers. Proposals for grants will be evaluated



as they are received and competition remains open until funds are depleted. A brief report on the activity will be required after the event has taken place.
