Verbs whose stems end in vowels have present stems which end in α , ϵ , o, or v.

Generally, the vowels in these stems lengthen in the future, aorist and perfect stems. for example: ποιέω, ποιήσω, ἐποίησα, πεποίηκα, πεποίημαι, ἐποιήθην

 α lengthens to η in the future, aorist and perfect stems:

pattern: stem + -άω, -ήσω, -ησα, -ηκα, -ημαι, -ήθην

example: νικάω, νικήσω, ένίκησα, νενίκηκα, νενίκημαι, ένικήθην conquer

Regular verbs. Not all verbs are attested in all tenses, moods, and voices, but the following verbs normally form their stems regularly: αἰτιάομαι (accuse, blame), ἀπαντάω (+ dat meet), βιάω (force, compel), γεννάω (beget), ἐάω (allow), ἐξαπατάω (deceive), ἐρωτάω (ask), ζάω (live), ἡσσάομαι (be inferior, be defeated), θεάομαι (watch), κτάομαι (acquire), νικάω (conquer, win), ὑρμάω (rush), πειράω (try), τελευτάω (finish, die), τιμάω (honor), τολμάω (dare).

Regular verbs. Not all verbs are attested in all tenses, moods, and voices, but the following verbs normally form their stems regularly: ἀξιόω (consider worthy), δηλόω (show), ἐλευθερόω (set free), ὑμοιόω (make like), ὑμόω (unite), ὀρθόω (set straight), πληρόω (fill), στεφανόω (surround, crown), χειρόω (manage, master), χόω (pile up, bury).
