

VERBS of SEEING and KNOWING in ANCIENT GREEK

Some verbs of seeing and knowing overlap in some tenses and forms.

Present Tense

- ὄράω see
- εἴδομαι (Homeric) appear
- οἶδα know
 - perfect indicative: οἶδα, οἶσθα, οἶδε, ἴσμεν, ἴστε, ἴσασι
 - subj: εἰδῶ, εἰδῆς, εἰδῆ, εἰδῶμεν, εἰδῆτε, εἰδῶσι
 - opt: εἰδείην, εἰδείης, εἰδείη, εἰδεῖμεν/ εἰδείημεν, εἰδεῖτε/ εἰδείητε, εἰδεῖεν/ εἰδείησαν
 - inf: εἰδέναι
 - imp: ἴσθι, ἴστε
 - part: εἰδώς, εἰδυῖα, εἶδος
 - Ἰδοῦ Look!
- σκοπέω look at

Imperfect Tense

- ὄράω → ἔωραν
- οἶδα → ἤδη
 - pluperfect indicative: ἤδη/ἤδειν, ἤδησθα/ἤδεις, ἤδει, ἤσμεν/ἤδεμεν, ἤστε/ἤδετε, ἤσαν/ἤδεσαν
- σκοπέω → ἐσκόπουν

Future Tense

- ὄράω → ὄψομαι
- οἶδα → εἴσομαι
- σκοπέω → σκέψομαι

Aorist Tense

- ὄράω → εἶδον
- σκοπέω → ἐσκεψάμην

Perfect Tense

- ὄράω → ἐόρακα or ἐώρακα; ἔωραμαι or ἐώρακα
- σκοπέω → ἐσκεμμαί

Aorist Passive

- ὄράω → ὢφθην
- σκοπέω → ἐσκέφθην
